## From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary! Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

First, I encourage all our parishioners to take part in the St. Michael Fall Festival this Sunday! We will have food, games for children, a corn hole tournament and a silent auction as well. Come to spend some fun time with friends and family!

During this month of October all Catholics are encouraged to grow in devotion to the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary! For a time after the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) the practice of praying the Holy Rosary waned among many Catholics around the world. Such a falling away from praying the Holy Rosary was not part of the Second Vatican Council. Rather, it was part of a misinterpretation and misrepresentation of true devotion to the Virgin Mary and the real teaching from the Second Vatican Council. Thankfully, there has been a resurgence of devotion to the favored practice of frequently praying the Holy Rosary. St. John Paul II helped to foster devotion to the Holy Rosary immensely throughout his long pontificate (1978-2005), especially through his Apostolic Letter, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae* (*The Holy Rosary of the Virgin Mary*, released in October, 2002) and by declaring a year of the Holy Rosary (from October, 2002 – October, 2003).

In his Apostolic Letter on *The Holy Rosary of the Virgin Mary*, St. John Paul II listed a new set of five mysteries called the Luminous Mysteries. This has been a great blessing for all the faithful! I encourage you to pray the Holy Rosary every day! I encourage you to pray the Holy Rosary with your spouse and your family! I encourage you to come to the Holy Mass early and pray the Holy Rosary with other parishioners! I encourage you to turn to our Blessed Mother Mary each day and throughout the day to find comfort, answers, courage and innumerable graces for every need. This can happen through the Holy Rosary and devotion to the Virgin Mary! Here are the words of St. John Paul II to encourage all of us even more: "The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer. In the sobriety of its elements, it has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of the prayer of Mary, her perennial *Magnificat* for the work of the redemptive Incarnation which began in her virginal womb. With the Rosary, the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of His love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer." (The Holy Rosary of the Virgin Mary, 1)

Here are a few more quotes from the saints on the Holy Rosary: "The faults of children are not always imputed to the parents, especially when they have instructed them and given good example. Our Lord, in His wondrous Providence, allows children to break the hearts of devout fathers and mothers. Thus the decisions your children have made don't make you a failure as a parent in God's eyes. You are entitled to feel sorrow, but not necessarily guilt. Do not cease praying for your children; God's grace can touch a hardened heart. Commend your children to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. When parents pray the Rosary, at the end of each decade they



#### They will guard you in all your ways

"He has given His Angels charge over you to guard you in all your ways. Let them thank the Lord for His Mercy; His wonderful works are for the children of men. Let them give thanks and say among the nations, the Lord has done great things for them. O Lord, what is man that you have made Yourself known to him, or why do you incline Your Heart to him? And you do incline Your Heart to him; You show him Your care and Your concern. Finally, You send Your only Son and the Grace of your Spirit, and promise him a vision of Your countenance. And so, that nothing in Heaven should be wanting in Your concern for us, You send those Blessed Spirits to serve us, assigning them as our guardians and our teachers.

He has given His Angels charge over you to guard you in all your ways. These words should fill you with respect, inspire devotion and instill confidence; respect for the presence of Angels, devotion because of their loving service, and confidence because of their protection. And so the Angels are here; they are at your side, they are with you, present on your behalf. They are here to protect you and to serve you. But even if it is God who has given them this charge, we must nonetheless be grateful to them for the great love with which they obey and come to help us in our great need. So let us be devoted and grateful to such great protectors; let us return their love and honor them as much as we can and should. Yet all our love and honor must go to Him, for it is from Him that they receive all that makes them worthy of our love and respect. We should then, my brothers, show our affection for the Angels, for one day they will be our co-heirs just as here below they are our guardians and trustees appointed and set over us by the Father. We are God's children although it does not seem so, because we are still but small children under guardians and trustees, and for the present little better than slaves.

Even though we are children and have a long, a very long and dangerous way to go, with such protectors what have we to fear? They who keep us in all our ways cannot be overpowered or led astray, much less lead us astray. They are loyal, prudent, powerful. Why then are we afraid? We have only to follow them, stay close to them, and we shall dwell under the protection of God's Heaven." (From a sermon by St. Bernard, abbot)

Join Pope Leo in praying the Rosary this October: In his weekly general audience on September 24, Pope Leo XIV asked all Catholics to pray the rosary every day during the month of **October** for peace. He reminded the faithful of the upcoming feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7, and that the Catholic Church traditionally dedicates the whole month of October to praying the rosary. "I invite everyone to pray the rosary every day during the coming month—for peace—personally, with your families and in your communities," he said. In addition, the faithful will gather in Rome in St. Peter's Square on October 11 at 6:00 PM to pray the rosary together. This Rosary for Peace will be held during the Jubilee of Marian Spirituality, which takes place on October 11-12. October 11 also marks the 63rd anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council. Pope Leo invited Christians to share with others "the love of Jesus that illumines and lifts up humanity." Please prayerfully consider praying the rosary each day this October if you do not already practice this devotion regularly.
