From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

The month of October is dedicated to growing in devotion to the Holy Rosary. The Holy Rosary may be the most popular devotion for Catholics. However, there are still many Catholics who either do not know how to pray the Holy Rosary or pray it infrequently.

In 1917 our Blessed Mother Mary appeared to the three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal. During her apparitions she asked that the Holy Rosary be prayed for peace. Do you know how to pray the Holy Rosary? If not, I encourage you to learn today! Do you pray the Holy Rosary rarely or not at all? If so, I encourage you to begin praying the Holy Rosary every day!

It has long been held in the Church that Our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Dominic in the year 1208 and, later, around the year 1460, our Lord Jesus spoke to Blessed Alan de la Roche to urge preaching of the prayer devotion of the Holy Rosary. Monks of that era were already accustomed to daily praying from memory all 150 Psalms as found in the Book of Psalms. Our Blessed Mother urged promoting the Holy Rosary so that this prayer would become a daily habit offered by all the faithful, not just those in the religious life.

The Virgin Mary offers Promises to those who pray the Holy Rosary daily.

Our Blessed Mother made 15 <u>promises</u> to those who recite it daily. These are big promises and the Graces we can receive through a prayerful recitation of the Holy Rosary can help any Catholic live a holy life. Here are the promises of our Blessed Mother:

- 1. To all those who shall pray my Rosary devoutly, I promise my special protection and great graces.
- 2. Those who shall persevere in the recitation of my Rosary will receive signal Graces.
- 3. The Rosary will be a very powerful armor against Hell; it will destroy vice, deliver from sin, and dispel heresy.
- 4. The Rosary will make virtue and good works flourish, and will obtain for souls the most abundant Divine Mercies. It will draw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
- 5. Those who trust themselves to me through the Rosary will not perish. 6. Whoever recites my Rosary devoutly, reflecting on the mysteries, shall never be overwhelmed by misfortune. He will not experience the anger of God nor will he perish by an unprovided death. The sinner will be converted; the just will persevere in Grace and merit eternal life.
- 7. Those truly devoted to my Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church.
- 8. Those who are faithful to recite my Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the Light of God and the plenitude of His Graces and will share in the merits of the blessed.
- 9. I will deliver promptly from Purgatory souls devoted to my Rosary. 10. True children of my Rosary will enjoy great glory in Heaven.
- 11. What you shall ask through my Rosary you shall obtain.
- 12. To those who propagate my Rosary I promise aid in all their necessities.
- 13. I have obtained from my Son that all the members of the Rosary

The power of the Rosary is beyond description."

Be Not Afraid!

"Peter came to Rome! What else but obedience to the inspiration received from the Lord could have guided him and brought him to this city, the heart of the Empire? Perhaps the fisherman of Galilee did not want to come here. Perhaps he would have preferred to stay there, on the shores of Lake of Genesareth, with his boat and his nets. Yet guided by the Lord, obedient to His inspiration, he came here!

According to an ancient tradition, Peter tried to leave Rome during Nero's persecution. However, the Lord intervened and came to meet him. Peter spoke to Him and asked. "Quo vadis, Domine?" - "Where are You going, Lord?" And the Lord answered him at once: "I am going to Rome to be crucified again." Peter went back to Rome and stayed here until his crucifixion.

Our time calls us, urges us, obliges us, to gaze on the Lord and to immerse ourselves in humble and devout meditation on the mystery of the supreme power of Christ Himself. He who was born of the Virgin Mary, the carpenter's Son (as He was thought to be), the Son of the living God (as confessed by Peter), came to make us all "a kingdom of priests".

The Second Vatican Council has reminded us of the mystery of this power and of the fact that Christ's mission as Priest, Prophet-Teacher and King continues in the Church. Everyone, the whole People of God, shares in this threefold mission. Perhaps in the past the tiara, that triple crown, was placed on the Pope's head in order to signify by that symbol the Lord's plan for His Church, namely that all the hierarchical order of Christ's Church, all "sacred power" exercised in the Church, is nothing other than service, service with a single purpose: to ensure that the whole People of God shares in this threefold mission of Christ and always remains under the power of the Lord; a power that has its source not in the powers of this world, but instead in the mystery of the Cross and the Resurrection.

The absolute, and yet sweet and gentle, power of the Lord responds to the whole depths of the human person, to his loftiest aspirations of intellect, will and heart. It does not speak the language of force, but expresses itself in Charity and Truth.

The new Successor of Peter in the See of Rome today makes a fervent, humble and trusting prayer: Christ, make me become and remain the servant of your unique power, the servant of your sweet power, the servant of your power that knows no dusk. Make me a servant: indeed, the servant of your servants.

Brothers and sisters, do not be afraid to welcome Christ and accept His power. Help the Pope and all those who wish to serve Christ and with Christ's power to serve the human person and the whole of mankind. Do not be afraid. Open, I say open wide the doors for Christ. To His saving power open the boundaries of states, economic and political systems, the vast fields of culture, civilization and development. Do not be afraid. Christ knows "that which is in man". He alone knows it. So often today, man does not know that which is in him, in the depths of his mind and heart. So often he is uncertain about the meaning of his life on this earth. He is assailed by doubt, a doubt which turns into despair. We ask you, therefore, we beg you with humility and with trust, let Christ speak to man. He alone has Words of Life, yes, of Life Eternal." (From the Homily of Pope St. John Paul II for the Inauguration of his Pontificate)



Plenary Indulgence for Souls in Purgatory - November 1 - 8 Dear Parishioners, According to the Enchiridion of Indulgences of the Catholic Church a Plenary Indulgence is available each day from November 1-8 for Catholics who devoutly visit and pray for the faithful departed in any cemetery. The usual conditions for a Plenary Indulgence apply:

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the State of Grace:

- have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- have made a Sacramental Confession of their sins (20 days before or after the pious work of mercy or prayerful action);
- receive the Holy Eucharist (20 days before or after the pious work of mercy or prayerful action);
- pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff (Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested)

Suggested prayer for a visit to a cemetery: 'Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen. May all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.'
